European Thematic Network for interactive and innovative knowledge exchange on animal health and nutrition between the **sheep** industry actors and stakeholders




EuroSheep is about practice-driven innovations to **improve sheep profitability through health and nutrition.**

This project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement N° 863056.








A network involving partners from eight of the main European sheep producing countries.

EuroSheep objectives

- Create a reservoir of informative and user-friendly best practices and innovations, through a combined 'top-down' and 'bottom-up' approach
- Encourage cross-fertilisation and exchange of knowledge through multi-actor workshops, at both national and international levels, involving interactive participation from all areas of the 'sheep community'
- Produce an easily understandable support package of communications and learning materials, web-based tools and an interactive website to help farmers, advisors/consultants, researchers and other stakeholders for maximum impact

EuroSheep implementation



In each of the 8 partner countries, a Network Facilitator fosters the multi-actor approach and facilitates the flow of information and knowledge at national and EU/international level.

They are supported by a Scientific and Technical Working Group, and by stakeholders through national Sheep-AKIS (Agriculture Knowledge Innovation System).
