

# Flock Health Plan

Need/issue: Sheep shed management.

**Aim:** To monitor the flock and to reduce the incidence of disease, farmer stress and cash leakage.

## How to implement:

- Biosafety:
  - Restricted access, with entry control for people, animals and vehicles not belonging to the farm.
  - Presence of sanitary ford at the farm gate
- Parasite control:
  - External: individual treatments if required.
  - Internal: periodic coprological analysis



## Description:

- Topics include:
  - Biosafety
  - Cleaning, disinfection and rat extermination of sheds
  - Parasite control
  - Disposal of cadavers through the official cadaver collection services.
  - Disposal of medical waste in appropriate containers.
  - Control of new animals at entry into the farm
  - Disease control and surveillance by incidence



















### **Expected benefits:**

- Improved ewe welfare
- Decrease in the use of antibiotics
- Increased yields
- Flock profitability.

#### Prerequisites and/or limits:

- Farm veterinarian, farmer training and confidence
- Contracts with authorized DDD and waste disposal companies
